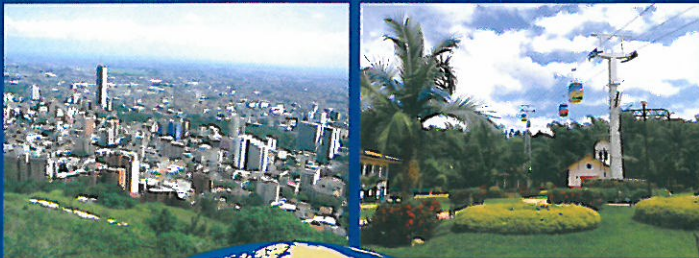

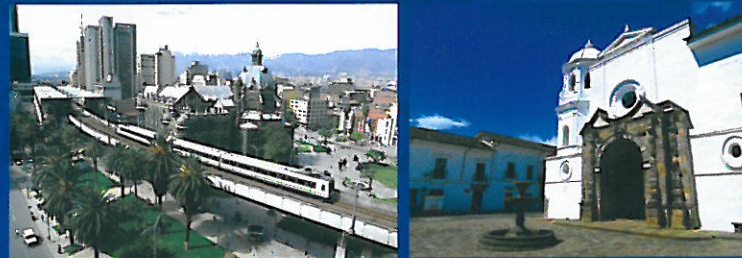

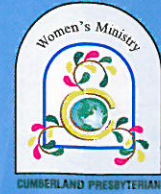

COLOMBIAN MISSION

In 1925, Mr. & Mrs. Walter Swartz arrived at the port of Buenaventura in the State of Cauca Valley. Rev. Swartz was the first Cumberland Presbyterian missionary to Colombia. In 1929, the first church was established in Cali, Cauca Valley State.

The Colombian CPC has two presbyteries: Cauca Valley Presbytery with 20 churches, 17 missions and 8 preaching points in the southwest of the country. Also, since 2013 a new mission started in the city of Villavicencio, in the eastern plains.

Andes Presbytery consists of 8 churches, 5 missions and 4 preaching points. Andes Presbytery is projecting that the churches in the State of Antioquia and the Atlantic Coast become a third presbytery.

EDUCATIONAL DEVELOPMENT

The school Americano has played a crucial role in the development of the church's mission. The Colegio Americano started thanks to the vision of the Cumberland Presbyterian Women's Board. They sent Ethel Brintle and Bernice Barnett in 1928 to open a school, which they did. It offered the opportunity to children from different ethnic backgrounds and creeds to study in a coeducational school at a low cost.

In 1948 and 1960 the Elementary School and the High School were respectively accredited. At the present time, the school is recognized as an educational institution that teaches Christian principles and has high academic standards.

The school has a current student enrollment of 1700 and 180 employees.

SOCIAL WORK

Social work for the church in Colombia is very important as a means to fulfill its mission. Some examples of this commitment are: Integral Development Centers, Hot Lunch Programs and Child Care Centers for children and young people from low income families. These projects are co-developed with governmental and ecclesiastical institutions. Children receive food as well as academic and pastoral support.

Hogar Gerontológico Samaria provides food, physical and occupational therapies, spiritual support and supervision of medications for senior residents.

Women Heads of Households Project is concerned about teaching and developing labor skills for women who are in charge of their families.
