



This design illustrates the people of God becoming the Body of Christ in the world. It intentionally looks like a Celtic cross. It is designed to resemble the denominational seal. It is unique, however, in the fact that the cross is composed of four people forming a circle.



This illustrates the church as being the Body of Christ, and that Cumberland Presbyterians are a connectional community. Although the people appear to be closing inward to the circle, the cross as a whole projects outward.



The people of God form a great circle. This is a circle of God's love and grace; like a wedding band, the kind that has no end, one that can never be broken. The circle also represents the world into which the church brings God's love and grace.



Looking deeper, the negative space inside the circle possesses another cross made of cups. This represents our bringing the Cup of Salvation to the four corners of the earth.

Ultimately the design resembles a cross. But it does just that, resembles a cross. We are always being transformed into the likeness of Christ, our Lord.
